**Bills:** Frank Koch made a motion (Claes Welch, 2<sup>nd</sup>) to pay \$32.00 to Steve Durow for the cost of obtaining the web site address (Flickertail.org). ## Recent Meeting Minutes

Saturday, January 21, 2006  
Monthly meeting at Trinity Lutheran Church, 10:00 am

The carving activity for the morning was the carving of snow snakes for the students at Highland acres grade school.

President Bob Pedigo called the meeting to order. There were 13 members present.

The minutes of the last meeting was read and approved. Treasurer Ron Holtz reported \$2,572 in the checking account with all bills paid.

Bob P. reminded the club members that the "Art in Motion" display will be at the Kirkwood Mall on Saturday, February 11 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The club members were encouraged to try to sit in the booth for part of the day to show their carvings at the show. Frank Koch is making a list of scheduled times and volunteers are needed to fill in the time slots.

Jerry Jaeger was introduced to the club as the newest member of the Flickertail Woodcarvers club. Welcome, Jerry!

The spring carving class with Barty Mckenzie will be held on Saturday and Sunday, April 1 and 2, 2006. He will be teaching a class of chip carving. The cost will be \$55 which includes the cost of the blank. Contact Frank Koch with any questions or to sign up for the class.

Ron Torgeson reported that the grant request submitted to MDU Resources has been denied due to the club being of a different tax status than the grant is established for. It may be possible to resubmit for the grant if the tax status of the club could change. The change of tax status would require the club by-laws to be revised. The possibility of the change may be considered at a later date.

Bob P. was informed that the supply of the membership cards was running low and more cards will be needed in the future. A motion to

purchase a supply of membership cards was made and seconded. Motion passed. The members were reminded that annual club dues of \$15 were due on January 1, 2006.

Stan S. reported that he will be conducting the class on March 18 on color mixing and painting. Members were asked to bring their own paintbrushes for the class. The paints and other supplies will be furnished. John Opp will be teaching a class in making a train whistle with a wood spirit carved on it. The class will be held on Tuesday, March 7, 2006.

A request for articles, drawings, pictures, etc., for the newsletter was again made by Bob Pedigo. Anyone interested in working with the newsletter should give Bob a call. Without articles, there is not going to be very much to the newsletters. So, everyone is encouraged to provide something to share with other carvers. Contact Bob P.

The minutes of the last meeting was read and approved.

Treasurer Ron Holtz reported \$1406 in the checking account. Stan Skarphol reported that there are about 80 carvers that have paid their dues for 2006.

The spring carving class with Barty Mckenzie will be held on Saturday and Sunday, April 1 and 2, 2006. He will be teaching a class of chip carving. The cost will be \$55 which includes

the cost of the blank. It appears there is enough interest to have a full class. Contact Frank Koch with any questions about the class.

Gerald Sears and his wife will be the instructors and featured carvers at our Annual Show which will be held on Saturday and Sunday, October 7&8 at the Trinity Lutheran Church. A class will be held starting on Friday, October 6. More about the class and the show will be coming in future newsletters.

The theme for this years show will be shore bird carvings. All carvers are encouraged to sign up for carving a shore bird on the clubs website or contact Frank to see what shore birds are still available. We are encouraged to carve a shore bird that no one else is carving so that there are a variety of carvings. There will be a shore bird carving display at the Bismarck Public Library at the same time of the show. It is suggested that all carvers carve 2 shore birds to be displayed—1 for the show and 1 for the display at the library. A third bird could be carved for the raffle to be held during the show, also.

A request for articles, drawings, pictures, etc., for the newsletter was again made by Bob Pedigo. Klaes Welch indicated that he would be willing to try his hand at working with the club newsletter. All members are encouraged to provide material for the newsletter. Without articles, there is not going to be very much to the newsletters.

Ron Holtz indicated there may be a change in how raffles are conducted in Bismarck. Carvings that are listed on the raffle tickets may need to be completed prior to the selling of the raffle tickets. This issue will be further investigated. Members are encouraged to donate a carving for the raffle.

The carving quilts that were completed for the 2005 show may be dismantled if they are not going to be on display. The pieces may be given back to the persons carving the quilt pieces. A decision on what to do with the quilts will be made at a later date.

Frank indicated that there is a need for a banner that the club can use for displaying at various functions. A motion was made and seconded to purchase a banner for the club to be used for display purposes at public functions. Cost would be about \$50. Motion carried.

Jim Lindseth inquired about the possibility

of getting more vests that some members have at this time. Jim will investigate and report his findings about the cost, sizes, etc., and will report his findings in the newsletter.

Jim Lindseth would like to remind all members that volunteers are needed for teaching projects at the whittle-ins for the upcoming year. Volunteers are needed for the whittle-ins to be held after June, 2006. Contact Jim if you can help out with a whittle-in project or class.

Frank Koch and Bob Pedigo were planning to look into the club banner that was approved for purchasing at the last monthly meeting.

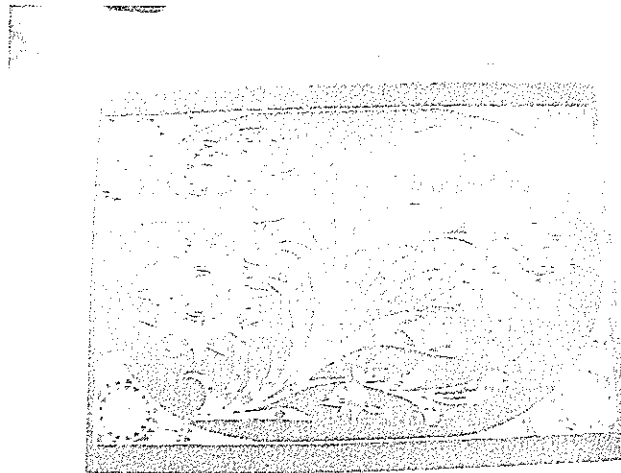

The spring carving class with Barry McKenzie was April 1 & 2, 2006. The class was full.



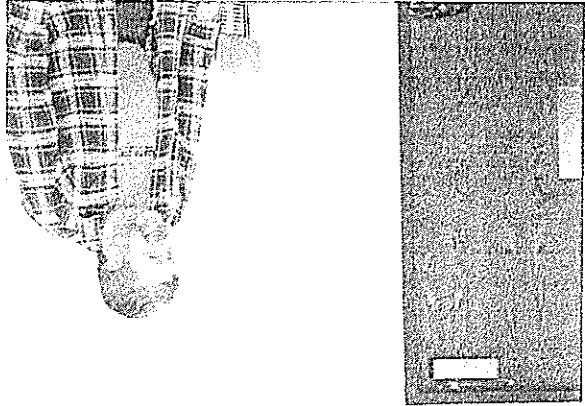

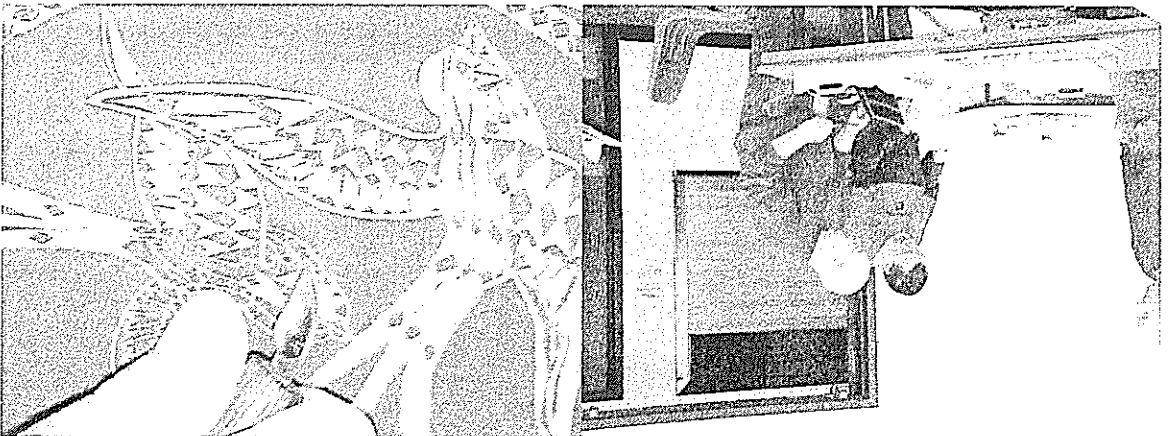

Bob Matzke chip carving “Birds”

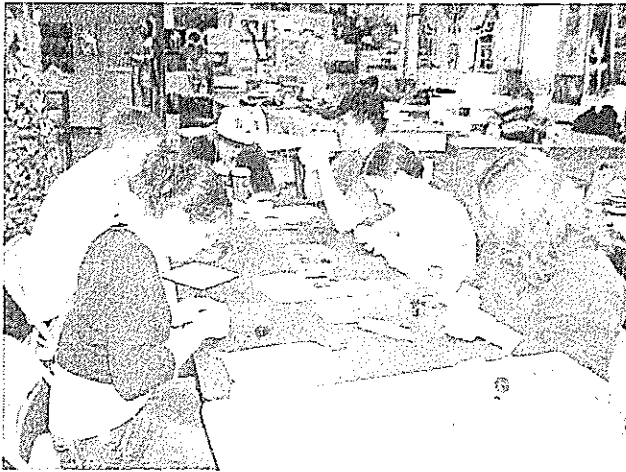


## DWAC Grant

The Flickertail Woodcarvers received a grant from the Dakota West Arts Council to purchase woodcarving tools and carving blanks to be used to teach beginning woodcarving to local high school art classes.

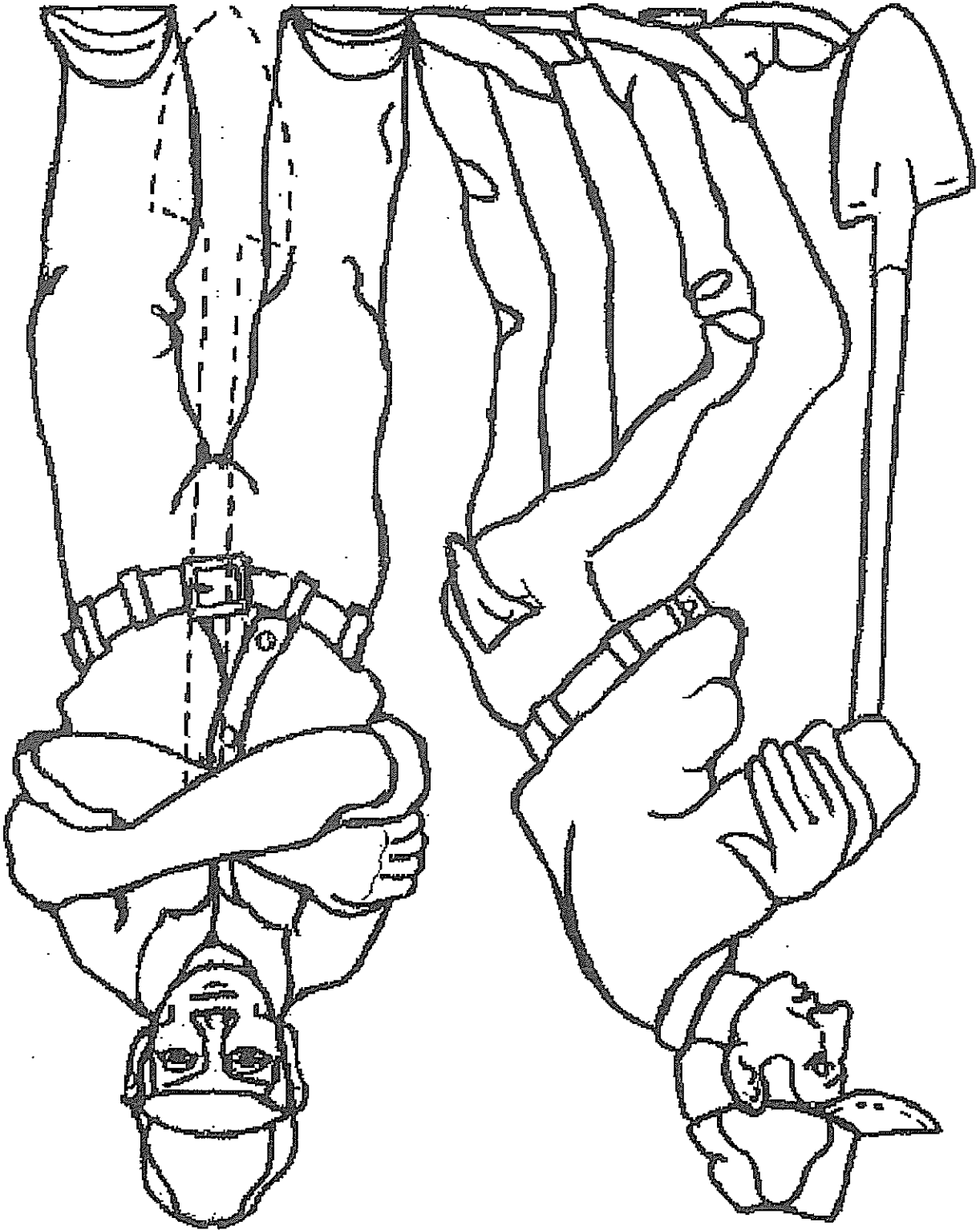
The 14 carving kits included the following items: knife, v-tool, u-tool, strop stick, carving glove, and a thumb protector. The blanks included two different style letter openers, chip carving practice piece, Christmas ornament, and graduate.

Frank Koch completed eight carving sessions in February at St. Mary's High School and, ten carving sessions during March at Bismarck High School. The art students enjoyed the woodcarving and strongly recommended that woodcarving be included in next years art classes.



## **Hugh McVarish, Reported by Frank Koch**

Many of you will remember Hugh McVarish from his years of participating in the annual Flickertail Woodcarving shows. We lost Hugh on April 17, 2006. Hugh was one of about a dozen woodcarvers from Winnipeg that attend the Bismarck and Fargo annual woodcarvings shows. Hugh was a very gifted artist. As a young man he taught himself sandblasting through correspondence, which launched his career. He became a monument engraver by trade, and later developed his skills in glass etching. With his intricate lettering abilities and sense of humor Hugh found many ways to apply his talents, print making, silk-screening, signs and posters, and for a short time publishing a comic strip in the Winnipeg Record. Hugh was also a great painter having won the Canadian National Calendar contest in 1984—one of his paintings was featured on the front of the calendar. He enjoyed teaching and sharing his knowledge.
